- a. Draw a map of the setting.
- **b.** Write a short story about what the character(s) would be doing one a year later.
- e. Write a letter to the author or illustrator.
- 3. For your book of choice. Complete one of the following assignments:
 - **a.** Draw a symbol- color, and cut out from poster board a single symbol that represents the theme of the novel. You will be asked to present the symbol, so you need to write one paragraph explaining why you chose it and how it represents the theme.
 - **b.** Create a technology product- using Prezi, PowerPoint, Google slides, or other appropriate technology and create a project of your design that explores the theme of the novel.

4. You may also choose one of the following after reading both books:

- **a.** Choose two people or characters from your two books that you think would be great friends and write why in essay format (5 paragraph).
- **b.** Choose one book location or setting to live in for a week- it can be fiction or nonfiction. Explain which book you chose and why in essay format (5 paragraph).
- **c.** Take a photo of each book cover you read and create a photo collage or animated trailer (you may use an app like Animoto or similar technology software).
- 5. These assignments are due by October 3, 2025 No exceptions.

******Do not email any of the assignments to Ms. Cerreta. You will be submitting them to google classroom. You will be able to submit them when you return to school in the fall.
